Orbus News – March 2019:

The CCAP Orbus Mission Primary and Secondary Schools

Enrolment numbers as at March 2019: Primary 368 + Secondary 98 for a total of 466. Boarders 42. Orphans and vulnerable: 130.

Report from the Secondary Head Teacher:

Orbus Farm:

- Maize harvest is promising for this year.
- Stocking has started.
- > This April we are selling sugarcanes
- > There are 13 goats
- > Broilers rearing to start soon, after maintenance of the kraal and revamping of solar water pump to have reliable water system.
- Money for broilers will come from selling three he goats.
- Vegetable plot to be cleared by mid April 2019

(C2) Building:

- Renovated the other hostel and is now accommodating male students.
- Planning to change the switches at the teaching area at the secondary, thus outside security lights to be outside so that watchmen can access the switching on and off.
- Planned to connect the water system to the flush toilets at the primary but delayed due to water problem as Blantyre water board water is expensive for a small school like Orbus.
- More on the developmental plan.

The Orbus Ministries Australia Inc. (OMA) funded development work in 2019 includes attempts to finish off the 2nd secondary classroom building started (photos below) and the new teacher's accommodation building (photos below). This is in addition to OMA's regular monthly teacher's and staff wages contribution and other minor expenses.



Finances: Current OMA funds are approximately A\$21,000.
